**Content**

Due to revisions to The Joint Commission (TJC) standards in 2007 and 2008, many organizations have been struggling to ensure that they clearly understand the circumstances for which TJC requires Focused Professional Practice Evaluation (FPPE), and to implement an effective, compliant Ongoing Professional Practice Evaluation (OPPE) process. Standards relating to practitioner performance data are not brand new, but there is now greater emphasis on practitioner-specific measurement and the use of this information to support the reappointment of physicians and advanced practice allied health professionals.

This one-day program will provide a comprehensive review of The Joint Commission medical staff standards, their effect on the accreditation process, and the requirements for all licensed independent practitioners who independently provide patient care. You will be provided with the tips you need to achieve compliance and implement a more effective competency management program at your facility.
